## **Product**

### Product description:

webertherm 340 underlagsbruk / webertherm 343 basbruk are factory-made fiber-reinforced dry mortars based on lime and cement with a well-graded white dolomite and natural sand as aggregates. When mixed with water, they are ready-to-use renders for outdoor use. webertherm 340/343 are specially designed for use in SERPOROC

webertherm 340/343 are specially designed for use in SERPOROC facade systems.

They are applied as the first thick base coat layer (> 10mm). Therm 340/343 are pigmented to facilitate measurement of thickness. The renders are sprayable and pumpable in a 60m hose. Therm 340/343 can be delivered in closed silos of 10 tons with a flow mixer to avoid dust.

### Cut-off criteria:

All major raw materials and all the essential energy is included. The production processes for raw materials and energy flows with very small amounts (less than 1%) are not included. These cut-off criteria do not apply for hazardous materials and substances.

#### Allocation:

The allocation is made in accordance with the provisions of EN 15804. Incoming energy and water and waste production in-house is allocated equally among all products through mass allocation. Effects of primary production of recycled materials is allocated to the main product in which the material was used. The recycling process and transportation of the material is allocated to this analysis.

#### Data quality:

Specific data for the product composition are provided by the manufacturer. They represent the production of the declared product and were collected for EPD development in the year of study. Background data is based on registered EPDs according to EN 15804, Ostfold Research databases, ecoinvent and other LCA databases. The data quality of the raw materials in A1 is presented in the table below.

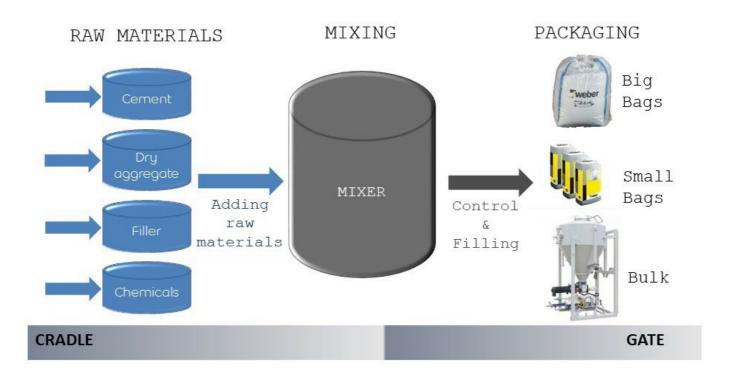

### System boundary:

All processes from raw material extraction to product from the factory gate are included in the analysis (A1-A3). In addition, transportation to a central warehouse placed in accordance with guidelines issued by the EPD Norway (A4) is included.

The flow chart below illustrates the system boundaries for the A1 to A3 part of the analysis.



### Additional technical information:

Therm 340/343 are mineral based renders in the certified Serporoc system with certificate number 0238-10 for wooden frames verified by RISE. The remaining powder is classified as hazardous waste. Cured material is inactive and not classified as hazardous waste and may be disposed as construction waste to disposal or recycling. The packaging properly emptied is not classified as hazardous waste.
